5 PIECES OF GEAR

YOU NEED TO RIDE A MOTORCYCLE

PART TWO: GLOVES

Motorcycle gloves offer added protection, safety, comfort, and style. They help protect your hands from serious injury, offer added grip strength for better control of your handlebars, and dampen vibrations from the road.

They Ensure Better Grip: After riding for several hours at a top speed with a really tight grip, your hands could become really sweaty. This could be really dangerous while riding your bike at very high speeds. A pair of gloves would be allowing a rider to keep on maintaining a really good grip even when sweaty.

They Maintain Warm Hands: Numerous people ride their motorcycles throughout the year and they would be riding a bike even during the extremely cold weather. It is a fact that cold weather riding minus the gloves could make your hands go completely numb thanks to the cold breeze blowing on them. It would then become impossible to carry on maintaining a good grip, if your hands have become numb due to the extreme cold. Gloves would help you in keeping your hands warm and your grip really strong.

They Ensure Protection: Gloves are helpful in protecting your hands from getting injured in case of any accidents. Often motorcyclists feel that gloves are worn mainly to add a touch of glamour and style element to their personality. But it is certainly not true. Gloves offer wrist protection. You could wear palm sliders for mitigating all the impact forces to the specific area. Palm sliders provide protection, flexibility, and comfort. They would be preventing your palm from getting rubbed badly against the pavement. They are able to convert a really harsh impact into a truly soft one. Palm sliders are just right for injury prevention.

They Prevent Injury: Your hands always touch the ground first thing when you are falling down from your motorcycle. In such a situation, it is always a good idea to wear a pair of protective motorcycle gloves. If you are putting on a pair of good fit motorcycle gloves then there is every possibility that you would not get badly bruised or injured fingers or hands as your gloves would keep you well-protected. If you are not wearing gloves, you could get badly injured and your hands could get badly bruised, broken or may need to be severed right from your wrists. So if you wish to avoid these consequences, wear your motorbike gloves every time you are riding.

Provides Absolute Knuckle Protection: It requires a tremendous amount of dexterity in maneuvering the handlebars while riding the motorcycle. Your fingers could feel numb if you go on doing that without wearing gloves. But if you wear top quality motorcycle gloves, then your fingers and hands would be agile and warm and at the same time would keep your knuckles well-protected.

An Adventure-specked 1,301 cc V-Twin means that entire cross-country journeys are dispatched easily, while Adaptive Cruise Control and Semi-active Suspension together with re-worked rider-focused ergonomics and technology bring agility and long distance comfort to an entirely new level. It's a bold claim, but we'll make it - the KTM 1290 SUPER ADVENTURE S is the new benchmark



A new 7-inch TFT dash boasts KTM MY RIDE

Bluetooth connectivity and cruise control helps riders pound the pavement on the way to new trailheads. For far-flung adventures, a waterproof compartment offers USB charging for personal devices. A new RACE ON remote keyless system, now featuring Anti-Relay Attack (ARA), allows the rider to start the bike, lock the steering, and open the gas cap without using the key.



Under the new bodywork, KTM tweaked the chromoly steel frame, shifting the steering head rearward by 0.6 inch. Further aft, the new aluminum subframe balances the 1290 Super Adventure S's weight distribution for optimal agility and stability. An extended open lattice swingarm also steadies the big-bore ADV at high speeds and under acceleration. WP APEX Semi-Active Technology (SAT) suspension

automatically adjusts damping parameters on the fly in Comfort, Street, and Sport modes. Owners can expand the SAT functions with optional Off-Road, Auto, and Advanced suspension modes

It's always interesting to chat with Odysseian about why they joined the club, and what their motorcycling interests are. There are some that just answer; "Good friends and a glass of good wine"

A few share conversational interest in my hobby of rebuilding classic Yamaha motorcycles, so I offer up the latest out of "The Bike Shed" a labour of love over 36 weeks.

A friend moved off to "Shady Pines" and had to get rid of his motorcycle and wanted just R5000.00 to pay for the furniture truck to move his worldly possessions. On collecting the bike, I loaded onto my trailer a 1987 Yamaha FZR1000 (2G) with the two headlights.

The Yamaha FZR1000 was an in-line four, four stroke racing motorcycle produced by Yamaha between 1987 and 1995 when the Yamaha R1 was introduced. The 1987 version of the FZR1000 had a top speed of 254 Km/h. It was the exact same bike used in superbike racing by the likes of Eddie Lawson.

The bike was crowned "Bike of the Year 1987" and later in 1989 "Bike of the Decade" With such a pedigree I had to do something, as the bike had been dropped on the right side, was badly damaged, and had been put together again with a miss-match of bolts and studs. Other components had been fitted retro which spoiled the originality.

Its always a nail-biting affair with an old bike, and a relief when that approval paper is handed to you, to fetch the motorcycle license.

The final result, and I must say that YAMAHA made a beautiful bike in 1987



I have ridden the bike, not a city commuter, but on the open road that throttle just keeps opening and the speedo keeps climbing into the hundreds. All my rebuilds are booked into "Helderberg Yamaha" for a 'service' where the mechanic goes thru the bike to check all the settings, and makes sure that I have done a good job for my own safety.

So what is next.....

Its there under covers, but that's another story.
