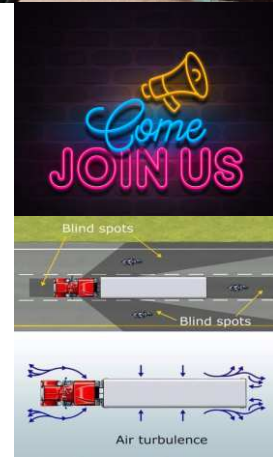

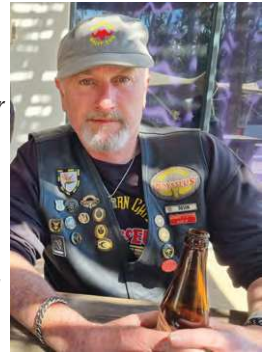
It is not fair, nor practical to expect the remaining three or four committee members to organize and run all club rides, meetings and events.

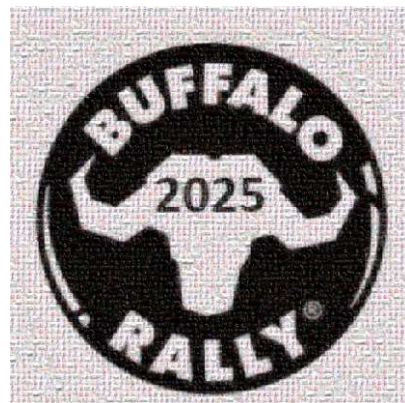

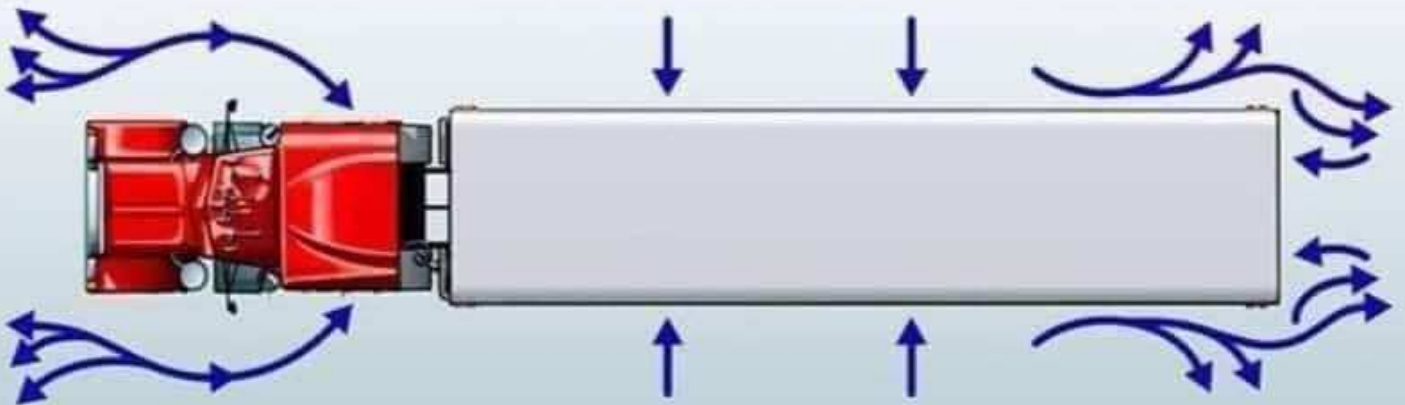
